

HOW YOUR 2024 TAXES WILL BE ALLOCATED





(S) BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The approved 2024 Operating and Capital/Special Project Budget highlights increased funding from grants, a slight increase in the mandatory levy, an increase in capital project spending, and a decrease in the reserve balance compared to 2023.

The residential tax rate, including the education tax, will see a 5.88% increase. Whitestone's tax rate continues to be one of the lowest compared to neighbouring municipalities.

The 2024 Capital initiatives include the purchase of a new fire pumper truck, which is a crucial addition to our emergency response capabilities. Other initiatives include the Bunny Trail slurry seal and repair, slurry seal on Farley's Road, and guide rail end treatments on Farley's Road bridge.

The closing balance of the asset management reserve has increased. The 2024 contribution to the asset management reserve was \$288,985.



WPS RECREATION AND CULTURAL **CENTRE UPDATE**

The Municipality of Whitestone entered into a Funding agreement with the Joint Municipal Services Board (JMSB) agreeing to a one-time payment of \$250,000 for Capital costs and annual Operating costs of \$18,316 (with annual CPI increases). The agreement required a review of the operating model, project operating costs and reserve requirements for the Facility by independent management consultants.

Council received the BDO report on November 9, 2023 and informed the JMSB that the report does not meet the requirements as set out in the agreement. On April 10, 2024: Council deferred the Capital Contribution to the year 2025 and until such time as the report meets the requirements of the Municipality. (Moved by Councillor Lamb, Seconded by Councillor Woods, recorded vote as follows: Councillor Nash-Yea, Councillor Woods-Yea, Councillor Bray-Abstain, Councillor Lamb-Yea; Mayor Comrie-Nay).



NEW Traffic and Parking By-law No. 33-2024

As of August 6, 2024, no person shall Park or leave a Trailer, Camping Unit or Boat separate from a Vehicle on a Highway or Designated Vehicle Parking Area (i.e. Boat Launches & Landings).

No person shall Park a Trailer, Camping Unit or Boat which is attached to a Vehicle for more than fourteen (14) days annually (consecutively or nonconsecutively) on a Highway or Designated Vehicle Parking Area (i.e. Boat Launches & Landings).
