

MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL

Your new council has been busy these last few months. We are currently finalizing the 2019 budget with a modest tax rate increase of 4.79%. As you know, we have minimally increased our tax rate in the past few years, but with inflation, modest increases are necessary to maintain levels of service. The complete 2019 budget will be on the website once formally approved by Council. A few key projects are Landfill site improvements, roads related projects, WahWahKesh Landing parking improvements, and funding for communications and website enhancements.

This year the large multi-plate culvert on the Bunny Trail is being replaced. This will mean an approximate three week road closure commencing after the Labour Day weekend. Every effort will be made to reduce this inconvenience and we will provide as much advance notice as possible. Council has been reviewing our Strategic Plan. This reviewed plan will be on the website soon for viewing and commenting.

Cemetery Board

On Wednesday, April 10, 2019, a research team from the University of Windsor presented the results of its Cemetery Research Project of the graveyards in the Municipality of Whitestone at the West Parry Sound Museum. In the summer of 2018, the research team lead by Dr. Chris Houser worked with Muriel Stiles of the Cemetery Board to locate unmarked graves in the Whitestone, Maple Island and Fairholme Cemeteries using Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR). The research study was initiated in conjunction with the Whitestone Historical Society. Location information is often incomplete in older cemeteries due to lack of records or lost records. This study was provided to the municipality through the Extension Sciences Program at the University of Windsor.



Thinking of building? Contact the building department to see if a building permit is required for your project. Remember that building without a permit is in contravention of By-Law No. 32-2015 and the Building Code Act S. O. 1992 Section 8(1).

A building permit is required for the installation or replacement of a dock/deck. Please visit our website for a complete list of projects that require a permit and contact information.

Whitestone Fire Department

Campfires are part of enjoying the outdoors but cause many wildfires each year. To keep your campfire safe, follow these guidelines:

- · Check for local restrictions.
- Ensure a responsible person is present.
- Use a designated fire pit.
- At least 5 meters from any buildings or forest.
- At least 2 meters from flammable material.
- Keep water and a shovel nearby.
- · Never leave your fire unattended.
- Put your fire out by dousing it with water, stirring and dousing again until coals are cold to the touch.

Remember: Your fire is your responsibility. If it gets away, you are responsible for damages and any costs of putting it

BURNING PERMITS REQUIRED from April 1 - October 31 each year for open air burning and incinerators.
